Driving Directions

From the North East (Rochester) and NYS Thruway (I-90): Take the I-190 exit toward Downtown Buffalo/Canada. Take Exit 7 for Church Street. Continue onto Church Street, then turn right onto Lower Terrace. Turn right immediately into Hotel (Fountain Circle).

From the South East (I-390 N): Take exit 6 for NY-36 toward Mt Morris. Turn left onto NY-36 N. Turn left onto Perry Rd. Turn right onto the NY-400 N ramp. Merge onto NY-400 N. Use any lane to take the I-90 exit toward Buffalo. Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 53 for I-190 toward Downtown Buffalo/Niagara Falls. Take exit 7 for Church Street. Continue onto Church St, then turn right onto Lower Terrace. Take an immediate right into Hotel (Fountain Circle).

From Buffalo Niagara International Airport: Head South continuing straight onto NY-33 W. Use the left 2 lanes to take the Oak Street/Oak St exit. Merge onto N Oak St. Turn right onto N Division St. Turn left onto Lower Terrace and take an immediate right into the Hotel (Fountain Circle).

If you are planning on flying to convention, the **Buffalo Niagara International Airport (BUF)** is the nearest airport (it is 17 minutes away from the hotel by car). There is a FREE Airport Shuttle to/from the Buffalo Grand Hotel. Local Attractions


Buffalo's landscape and skyline read like a textbook from an architectural master class.



City Hall Observation Deck – Come see the massive art-deco City Hall, which is on the National Historic Register. It features murals of the city's history and an observation tower on the 25th floor with sweeping views of Lake Erie and Buffalo. To see "Windows on Buffalo", take an elevator to the 25th floor and walk up 3 flights for a spectacular view of the Queen City! The observation deck is open 8:30am-4pm M-F. Free tours of the building are available Thursday and Friday from 12-1 PM. Recently named one of the "100 Things"

Every Western New Yorker Should Do At Least Once" by the Buffalo News, the tour covers the history of the building, the architectural elements, and takes you behind the scenes to view some of the best features of this art deco masterpiece. https://preservationbuffaloniagara.org/events/city-hall-tour/2020-04-23/

Guaranty Building – Trace the early origins of skyscraper design at the Guaranty Building. Originally built in 1896, this Adler & Sullivan designed structure is a highlight of Buffalo's downtown architecture. Come see the beautiful terra cotta tiles on the exterior and the incredible mosaic work on the interior. The building is generally open through the week M-F. Tours are available through Preservation Buffalo Niagara usually on Fridays from 2-3pm. Check their website for





Frank Lloyd Wright Darwin D. Martin House Complex – Also known as the Darwin Martin House National Historic Landmark, it was designed by Frank Lloyd Wright and built between 1903 and 1905. One of the crowning achievements of Wright's Career, this three-building complex (furnished with Wright's own designs!) is an indispensable look into the architect's process, aesthetic, and mid-career work. More patterns of art glass were designed for the

Martin House than for any other of Wright's Prairie Houses. http://www.martinhouse.org/

Shark Girl – Whimsical art installation of an Alice-in-Wonderland-style little girl with a Great White Shark head for you to take pictures with. She sits on a rock with an empty space for visitors. Currently out for a makeover over the winter; should return in early 2020. She is found at Canalside, look for where Pearl St. and Perry Blvd meet on the right of an open space. Look to the left where there is a pedestrian footbridge. She sits at the left end of that footbridge.

Burchfield Penney Art Center – The Burchfield Penney Art Center is the only museum dedicated to the art and artists of Western New York and the vision of artist Charles E. Burchfield. The center is an arts and educational institution that is a part of Buffalo State College. https://www.burchfieldpenney.org/

Buffalo & Erie County Botanical Gardens – The Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens are botanical gardens located within South Park in Buffalo, New York, United States. These gardens are the product of landscaping architect Frederick Law Olmsted, glass-house architects Lord & Burnham, and botanist and plant-explorer John F. Cowell. The



Botanical Gardens is open year-round and daily from 10am-4:30pm with a few special closings days throughout the year. The Botanical Gardens is a large indoor conservatory with surrounding grounds. It is handicapped accessible and offers plenty of free parking. The Botanical Gardens consists of 10 indoor greenhouses that are interconnected. When you visit the Botanical Gardens you will embark on a self-guided tour throughout the greenhouses, each displaying a different exhibit and collection of plants. https://www.buffalogardens.com/

Theodore Roosevelt Inauguration Site – The first inauguration of Theodore Roosevelt as the 26th President of the United States, took place on Saturday, September 14, 1901 at the Ansley Wilcox House, at 641 Delaware Avenue in Buffalo, New York, following the death of President William McKinley earlier that day. Experience TR's unusual 1901 inauguration like never before. With a combination of historically restored rooms and interactive exhibits, you'll feel as if you are part of the events of that fateful September, while gaining a new perspective on the issues Roosevelt faced during his presidency.


