Clubs that are using their tax exempt certificate must indicate such and pay with one club check. Certificates must be provided to hotel at least one week prior to arrival.

Please note that if you are coming to the convention and staying overnight, you must book your room through the hotel. While rates may be a bit cheaper through other travel websites, anything not booked through the hotel will not be counted toward our room guarantees stipulated in our contract. (And oftentimes, by the time you add on the state/county/room taxes on to the advertised price, it's pretty much the same amount give or take a couple dollars.) These room guarantees are provided as part of the negotiations with the hotel and are considerations for other no charge weekend amenities. These amenities help to keep the costs of the meetings low so that those extra fees are not passed along to the attendees.

Local Attractions

Saratoga Racino (Casino Gambling and Harness Track) - Located in historic Saratoga Springs, New York, Saratoga Casino is the place for over 1,700 exciting slots and electronic table games. The Racino includes live harness racing, simulcast wagering, delicious dining, live entertainment and a 117 room hotel all under one roof. It's the premiere destination for a good time in the Capital Region! Racing begins at 12:15pm at the Harness Track.

National Museum of Dance and Hall of Fame - The National Museum of Dance & Hall of Fame was established in 1986 as the only museum in the nation and one of the few in the world that is dedicated entirely to the art of dance. The Museum is located in the former Washington Bathhouse, a historic building in the Saratoga Spa State Park. The Museum's archives house a growing collection of photographs, videos, costumes, documents, biographies and artifacts that honor all forms of dance throughout history.

Congress Park Canfield Casino - Nestled within the gates of Congress Park lies the famed **Canfield Casino, a historic 1870s gambling casino,** named a National Historic Landmark. Although no longer used for gambling, Canfield is steeped with beautiful architectural detail and plays host to countless events and weddings. *QUICK Fact: Scenes were shot at the Canfield Casino for the 2003 feature film Seabiscuit.*

Local Attractions

Take a tour of the **Saratoga Springs History Museum**. Located in the Canfield Casino, visitors can learn more about the prolific history of Saratoga. Explore the Exhibition Room, the High Stakes Gambling Room, Belter Room, Walworth Museum, and the Saratoga Springs History Hall of Fame.

Saratoga Automobile Museum - The Museum's mission is to preserve, interpret and exhibit automobiles and automotive artifacts. In addition to technical and design aspects, our educational focus is on the past, present and future social and economic impact of the automobile. The Museum is adjacent to the Saratoga Performing Arts Center and near the landmark Gideon Putnam Hotel. Within walking distance in the Park are the National Museum of Dance, the Spa Little Theatre and the lavish Hall of Springs banquet facility.

MC Illions Carousel - In 1910, **Marcus Charles Illions** carved 28 horses to craft a carousel with the intention of "wowing" children of all ages. Illions is widely considered to be the one of the **greatest carousel carvers in the world**, and his ponies are most known for their dazzling heads (each one carved by Illions himself) and well-decorated bodies. These 28 horses even featured real horsehair tails! For 77 years, children of all ages enjoyed riding Illions' carousel at many Saratoga County venues.

Saratoga National Historical Park and Battlefield - Saratoga National Historical Park has a number of attractions and activities that happen throughout the year. Visit the site of the historic Battle of Saratoga, take tours at the Schuyler House, check out the Saratoga Monument, walk through Victory Woods, and explore the battlefield.


