Checklist for Eligibility

1. An unmarried offspring who lives at home with their parent or legal guardian. The parent or legal guardian must currently reside in New York State and has for the last five years.

2. Applicant must be a high school graduate or equivalent and completed at least one term of postsecondary education. A GPA of 2.50 or higher is required.

3. Attached application must be completed and returned.

4. A complete personal resume is required. It should include all work history, education, plus involvement in any extracurricular activities, clubs, civic or community service.

5. At least two letters of recommendation that state the strengths and character of the applicant. The name, address, and phone number of the person writing the recommendation, as well as, the nature of the relationship and the length of time the applicant is known by said individual

must be included.

6. Official sealed copies of academic transcripts from High School, College, or other accredited educational institutions attended. If the Applicant is a college Junior, Senior or Post Graduate, the High School Transcript is not needed.

7. Applicant must submit a 250-400 word essay. The title must be "How Higher Education Will Affect My Future." The essay must be typewritten, double-spaced and printed on white paper only.

8. Copies of Birth Certificates for the applicant and the multiple birth children (to verify multiple birth family status).

9. All documents need not be sent at the same time but must be postmarked no later than February 20th. In the lower left hand corner of all envelopes it must be written, "To be opened by the MSS Chairperson only."

All required documents will need to be to me by February 20, 2023. Thank you on behalf of the MSS Committee.

It was great to be together in person for the first time in three years – seeing old friends and making new friends. Many thanks to POM of CNY for hosting the weekend.

At the Friday, April 29th Executive Board meeting, a nomination was made to elect Michele Camilleri as Recording Secretary for the remainder of the 21 – 22 year and for the 22 – 23 year. This motion was approved.

At the 57th Annual State Meeting for the New York State Organization Mothers of Twins Club held on Saturday, April 30th , Michele Camilleri was installed as Recording Secretary,

The amended Bylaws and Standing Rules, recommended by the Executive Board at the October 16th Midterm meeting for approval to the general membership, were presented and approved.

In addition, at the Friday, April 29th Executive Board meeting, a motion was presented and approved to recommend to the membership the addition of Article XIII: Dissolution as presented by the ad hoc committee.

#### Article XIII DISSOLUTION

Should it become necessary, the Executive Board, after review and discussion, will recommend to the member clubs the dissolution of NYSOMOTC.

A. This recommendation would be presented at the Saturday General Meeting and would require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the properly certified and registered delegates and in accordance with all New York State requirements.

B. In the event of the approval of the dissolution, NYSOMOTC will be disbanded no later than six months from the date of the vote.

C. After all expenses have been satisfied, any remaining funds held by NYSOMOTC shall be distributed to a

Section 501(c)3 organization.

D. The organization chosen shall be by the recommendation of the Executive Board with the approval of a two-

thirds (2/3) vote of the properly certified and registered delegates at the Saturday General Meeting.

This proposed amendment is very basic and driven by the unforeseen circumstances and unplanned events that may lie ahead. The reasoning for proposing the amendment is should the NYSOMOTC face termination of its functions as a non-profit organization, the Bylaws must incorporate a statement of dissolution, which is also a requirement of the IRS. This amendment will provide the guidelines and stipulations of how the NYSOMOTC intends to distribute its remaining assets. A motion was made, and after discussion, Article XIII Dissolution was approved.

At this meeting MOTC Suffolk submitted their bid to host the 2024 State Meeting. As stated in Article IX State Meetings, Section 1 DATE, the State Meeting of NYSOMOTC shall be held annually on the last Saturday of April, which would be April 26 – 28, 2024. However, due to Passover starting the evening (sunset) of Monday, April 22 and ending the evening (sunset) of Tuesday, April 30, the date of this meeting will need to be changed. MOTC of Suffolk has not yet secured a location and to wait until the 2023 State Meeting to approve the change of date (either to earlier in April or the first weekend of May) would impact their being able to move ahead with their planning. For this reason, a motion was made and carried "that the General membership authorize the Executive Board to approve the 2024 State Meeting dates at the 2022 Midterm meeting." The bid by MOTC Suffolk to host the 2024 State Meeting was accepted.

12 I want to thank President Cartini and the membership for the opportunity to continue to serve NYSOMOTC as Parliamentarian. This past year has been a learning experience for me and I look forward to what the next year holds.
