At the 58 th Annual State Meeting for the New York State Organization Mothers of Twins Club, the following Election of Officers, Nominating Chairman and Nominating Committee Members took place. The results were as follow: President Kathy Brousseau Vice-President Pam Reussow Treasurer Susie Smith Recording Secretary Michele Camilleri Nominating Chairman Ruth Barone Nominating Committee Members Michelle Kesner Cathy Marsicano Jane Martinec Mary Lou Surmik In addition, Westside Suburban MOTC bid to host the 2025 State Meeting which was unanimously approved. Congratulations to all! The following ByLaws amendments were presented and approved: Article V Officers Section 4 - Letter B Vacancies occurring in any other elected or appointed office shall be filled for the unexpired term by a person elected by a majority vote of the Executive Board. Article VI Executive Board Section 5. Resignations A. Executive Board members must submit written notice to the State President with their intention to resign from their position in NYSOMOTC. B. Vacancies shall be appointed for the unexpired term by the President Article VII Nominations and Elections A. There shall be a Nominating Committee of five (5) members (Nominating Chairperson and four (4) Nominating Committee members) elected by the properly certified and registered delegates present at the Saturday General Meeting. Current letter A becomes Letter B. Current letter C remains the same. Article VIII State Committees Section 2 Renaming of Calligraphy and Chaplain to Certificates and Reflections and placed in alphabetical order, respectively. The following Standing Rules were presented and approved: I. Meetings Letter C Midterm The location of the Midterm Executive Board Meeting will be determined with the approval of the President in consultation with the Elected and Appointed officers. IV. Publications Letter C The Credential mailing will be sent via regular mail and/or electronically based on the preference of the State Reps, Officers and Past Presidents. V. Plagues - Removal

The following MSS Procedural Guidelines were presented and approved:

Changing chairman to chairperson and use of non-gender specific pronouns throughout the guidelines document.

#5 MSS Fundraiser Letter E- Marie Simmons Scholarship Fundraiser: shall be responsible to prepare and distribute the materials for at least two annual fundraisers and collect all information and monies to and from clubs. (see NYSOMOTC Procedure Manual for specific duties).

#8 Applications Letter H- Copies of Birth Certificates for the applicant and the multiple birth children.

At the Sunday Executive Board meeting, President Kathy Brousseau requested approval for her appointed Officers: Advisor Lisa Cartini and Parliamentarian Kathy Lyman, which was given.

Under New Business at the Friday Executive Board, I recommended an ad hoc committee be formed to review the email protocol NYSOMOTC should be following specifically with regards to decisions being made by the Executive Board using email and how the final decision is reflected in our meeting minutes.

This committee would determine whether this is a Bylaw or Standing Rule and would bring their recommendations to the Executive Board at the Midterm Board meeting in October. At the Sunday Executive Board meeting, the following Board members agreed to serve: Kathy Lyman (current Parliamentarian), Myriam Lavora, Ruth Barone (past Parliamentarian), Michele Camilleri (Past President) and President Brousseau as an ex officio member.

Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to serve NYSOMOTC as Parliamentarian. Special thanks to President Cartini for appointing me in 2021 and to the Executive Board and the membership for your support during the past two years. It has been a real learning experience and given me a greater

appreciation for understanding why parliamentary procedure is essential to our organization. I wish Kathy Lyman great success as she takes on these responsibilities.
