Best Advice

From Westside Suburban Mothers of Twins Club

When you were pregnant, I bet you can remember everyone giving you advice about the pregnancy, having twins and the dos and don'ts of raising a child. Of course the members of Westside Suburban Mothers of Twins club were no exception to this. So we asked the question, what was the best advice you received about being pregnant and having twins?

I was complaining about how uncomfortable I was on a very hot August day while I was pregnant with my twins. I was visiting a friend and her parents. My friend's parent said to me, "In the span of your whole life time, this is just a blink of time." It may feel like this pregnancy was going to go on forever but it was just a blink in time. I remember these words often especially when I am going through a hard time, this too shall pass!

Joining a MOP group before finding Twins club was so helpful for my mental health. Happy Mom, Happy Kids! When Mom is happy usually so are the children. When I brought my boys home, I was nursing them both. They were having a difficult time latching on. I would cry that I was a bad Mom because I couldn't feed my babies. I gave myself permission to bottle feed because it didn't make me a failure and the babies were getting fed. It was just giving myself permission to do that that helped from another mom.

I had fraternal twin boys one of which has Down syndrome and Autism. I joined WSMOTC when they were 8 months old. It was only then that I was able to get a handle on taking care of them and being able to do other things. When I would attend the meetings I would describe situations that I was experiencing and each time my fellow Moms would remind me that my son was a baby first then he was a baby with Down syndrome. Every time I would describe a situation they would assure me it was a twin thing, having 2 babies at once, and all the pressures of being a mother of twins not because one of them had a disability. They always reminded me he was a baby first and all of what was going on was normal.

I was given the advice of keeping my twins on the same schedule, same eating, sleeping etc. That helped me tremendously. Always remember fed is best! Formula or breast, fed is best! When I came to WSMOTC asking about breastfeeding advice, immediately I was told to get a breast friend! It was a nursing pillow.

When it came time for school that there are no state guidelines in regards to separating or keeping twins together. It was so helpful to have the support of fellow moms when making the best decision for our family and it was ok to change our minds about their schooling as well.

Lastly, all of us were reminded through Twins club that our twins are individuals and that they will like, react and do things different than their sibling. Sometimes the opposite sometimes similar so try and treat them as individuals.


